This Standard Bidding Documents was prepared, by NPA, in line with similar standard Bidding Documents used by multi-lateral international developing institutions, and shall be used by procuring entities for the procurement of Goods financed through public fund¹ using procurement methods; Open Bidding, Restricted Bidding and Single-source procurement.

This document has been prepared in the light of the provisions of the Procurement Law and Rules of Procedure, and in case of any differences between the provisions of this bidding document and those of the Procurement Law and Rules of Procedure, preference shall be given to the Procurement Law and Rule of Procedure.

On introduction of this Standard Bidding Document for use, the Standard Bidding Document for Procurement of Goods attached with circular number (PPU/C016/1386, issued by Procurement Policy Unit (PPU) of the Ministry of Finance (MoF) shall be nullified and unusable.

Compliant to the provisions of article 4.2 of the Procurement Law, procuring entities can use Standard Bidding Documents (SBD) of concerning donor agencies in procurements financed by the agencies.

SECTION 1 INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

A. GENERAL	
1. Scope of the Bid	<p>1.1 The Entity issues these Bidding Documents for the supply of Goods, and Related Services incidental thereto, as specified in Section 5 Schedule of Requirements. The name and identification number of this Tender are specified in the BDS. The name, identification, and number of lots are provided in the BDS.</p> <p>1.2 Throughout these Bidding Documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the term “IN WRITING” means communicated in written form (e.g. by email, fax, telex) with proof of receipt; (b) if the context so requires, “SINGULAR” means “PLURAL” and vice versa; and (c) “DAY” means calendar day.
2. Source of Funds	<p>2.1 The Entity guarantees that adequate public funds have been budgeted and allotted and are also available for managing the procurement proceedings toward the cost of the project. The Entity intends to apply a portion of the public funds to eligible payments under the contract for which this Bidding Documents are issued. “PUBLIC FUNDS” defines any monetary resources appropriated to procuring entities under Government budget, or revenues generated by statutory bodies and corporations or aid grants and credits put at the disposal of procuring entities by the development partners through the Government.</p>
3. Fraud and Corruption	<p>3.1 It is require that Entity, as well as Bidders, Suppliers, and Contractors and their subcontractors under Government-financed contracts, must observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts. In pursuance of that, the terms set forth as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) “corrupt practice” is the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party; (ii) “fraudulent practice” is any act or omission, including a misrepresentation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation; (iii) “collusive practice” is an arrangement between two or more parties designed to achieve an improper purpose, including to influence improperly the actions of another party; (iv) “coercive practice” is impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party

	<p>to influence improperly the actions of a party;</p> <p>(v) ““obstructive practice” is deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering or concealing of evidence material to the investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede a Government investigation into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation; or acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Government’s inspection and audit rights.</p> <p>3.2 will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the Bidder recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive or obstructive practices in competing for the contract in question;</p> <p>3.3 If the Entity determines at any time that representatives of the Entity engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices during the procurement process, The Entity having taken timely and appropriate action satisfactory to the Government to address such practices when they occur;</p> <p>3.4 will sanction a firm, including declaring ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, to be awarded a Government financed contract if it at any time determines that the firm has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive or obstructive practices in competing for, or in executing, a Government financed contract;</p> <p>3.5 will have the right to require that a provision be included in bidding documents and in contracts financed by the GoA, requiring Bidders, suppliers, and contractors and their sub-contractors to permit the Government to inspect their accounts and records and other documents relating to the Bid submission and contract performance and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Government.</p>
<p>4. Eligible Bidders</p>	<p>4.1 A Bidder, and all parties constituting the Bidder, may have the nationality of any country, subject to the restrictions specified in BDS. A Bidder shall be deemed to have the nationality of a country if the Bidder is a citizen or is constituted, incorporated, or registered and operates in conformity with the provisions of the laws of that country. This criterion shall also apply to the determination of the nationality of proposed subcontractors or suppliers for any part of the Contract including Related Services.</p> <p>4.2 A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All Bidders found to have conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Bidders may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this bidding process, if they are have been affiliated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Entity to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications, and other</p>

	<p>documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under these Bidding Documents; or submit more than one Bid in this bidding process, except for alternative offers permitted under ITB Clause 13.</p>
	<p>4.3 The Entity shall not sign of the contract with bidder which is debarred or have been under debarment process. The list of debarred and under debarment firms is available at the website of NPA, www.npa.gov.af.</p>
	<p>4.4 Government owned enterprises shall be eligible only if they can establish that they do not have conflict of interest.</p>
	<p>4.5 Bidders shall provide such evidence of their continued eligibility satisfactory to the Purchaser, as the Entity shall reasonably request.</p>
<p>5. Eligible Goods and Related Services</p>	<p>5.1 All the Goods and Related Services to be supplied under the Contract may have their origin in any country in accordance with specifications made in BDS.</p> <p>5.2 For purposes of this Clause, the term “GOODS” includes commodities, raw material, machinery, equipment, and industrial plants; and “RELATED SERVICES” includes services such as insurance, installation, training, and initial maintenance.</p> <p>5.3 The term “ORIGIN” means the country where the goods have been mined, grown, cultivated, produced, manufactured or processed; or, through manufacture, processing, or assembly, another commercially recognized article results that differ substantially in its basic characteristics from its components.</p>

<p>6. Sections of Bidding Documents</p>	<p>6.1 The Bidding Documents consist of Parts 1, 2, and 3, which include all the Sections indicated below, and should be read in conjunction with any Addendum issued in accordance with ITB Clause 8.</p> <p>PART 1 Bidding Procedures</p> <p>Section 1 Instructions to Bidders (ITB)</p> <p>Section 2 Bidding Data Sheet (BDS)</p> <p>Section 3 Evaluation and Qualification Criteria</p> <p>Section 4 Bidding Forms</p> <p>PART 2 Supply Requirements</p> <p>Section 5 Schedule of Requirements</p> <p>PART 3 Contract</p> <p>Section 6 General Conditions of Contract (GCC)</p>

	<p>6.2 The Invitation for Bids issued by the Entity is not part of the Bidding Documents.</p>
	<p>6.3 The Entity is not responsible for the completeness of the Bidding Documents and their addendum, if they were not obtained directly from the Entity or through its agent as stated in the BDS.</p>
	<p>6.4 The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the Bidding Documents. Failure to furnish all information or documentation required by the Bidding Documents may result in the rejection of the Bid.</p>
<p>7. Clarification of Bidding Documents</p>	<p>7.1 A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Documents shall contact the Entity in writing at the Entity’s address specified in the BDS. The Entity will respond in writing to any request for clarification within three (3) days, provided that such request is received at least seven (7) days in open bidding and four (4) days in restricted bidding prior to the deadline for submission of Bids. The Entity shall forward copies of its response to all those who have acquired the Bidding Documents directly from it, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source.</p>
	<p>7.2 Should the Entity deem it necessary to amend the Bidding Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under ITB Clause 8 and ITB Sub-Clause 24.2.</p>
	<p>7.3 To clarify issues and to answer questions on any matter arising in the Bidding Documents, the Entity may, if stated in the BDS, invite prospective Bidders to a Pre-Bidding Meeting at the place, date and time as specified in the BDS.</p>
	<p>7.4 The Bidder is requested to submit any questions in writing so as to reach the Entity not later than three (3) days prior to the date of the meeting.</p>
	<p>7.5 Minutes of the pre-Bidding meeting, including the text of the questions raised and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting, will be transmitted within five (5) days to all those who received the Bidding Documents.</p>
	<p>7.5 Non-attendance at the pre-Bidding meeting will not be a cause for disqualification of a Bidder.</p>
<p>8. Amendment of Bidding</p>	<p>8.1 (3) Days prior to the deadline for submission of Bids, the Entity may amend the Bidding Documents by issuing addendum.</p>

Documents	8.2 Any addendum issued shall be part of the Bidding Documents and shall be communicated in writing to all who have obtained the Bidding Documents directly from the Entity.
	8.3 To give prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take an addendum into account in preparing their Bids, the Entity may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Bids, pursuant to ITB Sub-Clause 24.2.
C. PREPARATION OF BIDS	
9. Cost of Bidding	9.1 The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Bid, and the Entity shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.
10. Language of Bid	10.1 The Bid, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Bid exchanged by the Bidder and the Entity, shall be written in the language specified in the BDS . Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Bid may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages into the language specified in the BDS , in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Bid, such translation shall govern.
11. Documents Comprising the Bid	<p>11.1 The Bid shall comprise the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Bid Submission Form and the applicable Price Schedules, in accordance with ITB Clauses 12, 14, and 15; (b) Bid Security or Bid-Securing Declaration, in accordance with ITB Clause 21, if required; (c) written confirmation authorizing the signatory of the Bid to commit the Bidder, in accordance with ITB Clause 22; (d) documentary evidence in accordance with ITB Clause 16 establishing the Bidder’s eligibility to bid; (e) documentary evidence in accordance with ITB Clause 17, that the Goods and Related Services to be supplied by the Bidder are of eligible origin; (f) documentary evidence in accordance with ITB Clauses 18 and 30, that the Goods and Related Services conform to the Bidding Documents; (g) documentary evidence in accordance with ITB Clause 19 establishing the Bidder’s qualifications to perform the contract if its Bid is accepted; and (h) any other document required in the BDS.
12. Bid Submission	12.1 The Bidder shall submit the Bid Submission Form using the form furnished in Section 4 Bidding Forms . And signed by authorized

Form and Price Schedules	person, this form must be completed without any alterations to its format. If not the bidder disqualified.
	12.2 The Bidder shall submit the Price Schedules for Goods and Related Services, according to their origin as appropriately signed by authorized person (Director, Deputy or Authorized representative) using the forms furnished in Section 4 Bidding Forms .
13. Alternative Bids	13.1 Unless otherwise specified in the BDS , alternative Bids shall not be considered.
14. Bid Prices and Discounts	14.1 The prices and discounts quoted by the Bidder in the Bid Submission Form and in the Price Schedules shall conform to the requirements specified below.
	14.2 All lots and items must be listed and priced separately in the Price Schedules.
	14.3 The price to be quoted in the Bid Submission Form shall be the total price of the Bid, excluding any discounts offered.
	14.4 The Bidder shall quote any unconditional discounts and indicate the method for their application in the Bid Submission Form and price schedules, if not the proposed discount shall not be acceptable.
	14.5 The terms shall be governed by the rules prescribed in the current edition of <i>Incoterms</i> , published by the International Chamber of Commerce, Paris, as specified in the BDS .
	14.6 Prices quoted by the Bidder are considered fixed and are not subject to variation on any account during the contract execution, unless otherwise specified in the BDS . A Bid submitted with an adjustable price is treated as non responsive and pursuant to ITB Clause 30 shall be rejected. However, in accordance with the BDS , if fixed prices quoted by the Bidder subject to adjustment during the Contract execution, then, submitted fixed price quotation shall not be rejected, but the price adjustment is treated as zero.
	14.7 The Entity can divide procurement for lots in accordance to Clause fifteenth (15) of Procurement Law, prices quoted shall correspond to 100 % of the items specified for each lot and to 100% of the quantities specified for each item of a lot. If the price unquoted for all items of each lot the part 2 sub-rule (1) of rule forty eighth (48) of procurement procedure shall be applied. Bidders wishing to offer any price reduction (discount) for the award of more than one Contract if the Bids for all lots are submitted and opened at the same time.
15. Currencies of Bid	15.1 The Bidder shall quote in the currency of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan the portion of the Bid price that corresponds to

	expenditures incurred in the currency of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, unless otherwise specified in the BDS .
16. Documents Establishing the Eligibility of the Bidder	16.1 To establish their eligibility in accordance with ITB Clause 4, Bidders shall complete the Bid Submission Form, included in Section 4 Bidding Forms . If not submitted or submitted incomplete the bidder disqualified
17. Documents Establishing the Eligibility of the Goods and Related Services	17.1 To establish the eligibility of the Goods and Related Services in accordance with ITB Clause 5, Bidders shall complete the country of origin declarations in the Price Schedule Forms, included in Section 4 Bidding Forms .
18. Documents Establishing the Conformity of the Goods and Related Services	18.1 To establish the conformity of the Goods and Related Services to the Bidding Documents, the Bidder shall furnish as part of its Bid the documentary evidence that the Goods conform to the technical specifications and standards specified in Section 5 Schedule of Requirements .
	18.2 The documentary evidence may be in the form of literature, drawings or data, and shall consist of a detailed item by item description of the essential technical and performance characteristics of the Goods and Related Services, demonstrating substantial responsiveness of the Goods and Related Services to the technical specification, and if applicable, a statement of deviations and exceptions to the provisions of the Schedule of Requirements.
	18.3 The Bidder shall also furnish a list giving full particulars, including available sources and current prices of spare parts, special tools, etc., necessary for the proper and continuing functioning of the Goods during the period specified in the BDS following commencement of the use of the goods by the Entity.
	18.4 Standards for workmanship, process, material, and equipment, as well as references to brand names or catalogue numbers specified by the Entity in the Schedule of Requirements, are intended to be descriptive only and not restrictive. The Bidder may offer other standards of quality, brand names, and/or catalogue numbers, provided that it demonstrates, to the Entity’s satisfaction, that the substitutions ensure substantial equivalence or are superior to those specified in the Schedule of Requirements.
19. Documents Establishing the Qualifications of the	19.1 The documentary evidence of the Bidder’s qualifications to perform the contract if its Bid is accepted shall establish to the Entity’s satisfaction: (a) that, if required in the BDS , a Bidder that does not manufacture or produce the Goods it offers to supply shall submit the Manufacturer’s Authorization using the form included in Section 4

<p>Bidder</p>	<p>Bidding Forms to demonstrate that it has been duly authorized by the manufacturer or producer of the Goods to supply these Goods in the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan;</p> <p>(b) that, if required in the BDS, in case of a Bidder not doing business within the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, the Bidder is or will be (if awarded the contract) represented by an Agent in the country equipped and able to carry out the Supplier’s maintenance, repair and spare parts-stocking obligations prescribed in the Conditions of Contract and/or Technical Specifications; and</p> <p>(c) that the Bidder meets each of the qualification criterion specified in Section 3 Evaluation and Qualification Criteria.</p> <p>19.2 In case of JV for two or more partners the bidder shall observe the following terms:</p> <p>(a) the bid shall include qualification information of all partners;</p> <p>(b) the bid shall be signed and stamped by all partners for legitimization;</p> <p>(c) all partners are jointly liable for execution of the contract pursuant to its terms and conditions.</p> <p>(d) The lead partner is responsible for accepting liabilities, guidelines on behalf of other partners;</p> <p>(e) Contract execution and payments occur to lead partner;</p> <p>(f) JV agreement shall be signed and stamped by all partners;</p> <p>91.3 To comply with minimum bidders’ Qualification Requirements, each partner shall meet minimum of (25) percent and the lead minimum of (40) percent of eligibility criteria. Eligibility percentage of each partner is added up and the total percentage of eligibility criteria for all partners shall be (100) percent. <p>20. Validity Period of the Bids</p>	<p>20.1 The entity specifies and inserts the Bids validity period in the BDS. This period in National Competitive Bidding (NCB) cannot be less than (90) day just after bid submission date. A Bids not meeting this period are considered non-responsive and are subject to rejection. In International Competitive Bidding (ICB) the bid submission period cannot be less than (120) day.</p> <p>20.2 In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the Bid validity period, the entity may request Bidders in written to extend the validity period of their Bids. Parallel to extension of bid validity period, bid Security validity period shall also be extended. The Bidder cannot amend/modify his bid once extended. Bid security is released if bidder refuses to extend validity period of the bid upon request.</p>

INTRODUCTION

AFTEL Corporation, on behalf of its Information Technology Department (the “IT Department”), is issuing this Request for Proposals (the “RFP”) to solicit responses from qualified contractors (“Respondents”) with experience in procuring, installing and supporting Cisco high-end Routers and Switches, with a proven track record of similar projects. Respondents must be Cisco certified with having related Cisco MAF (Manufacturer Authorization Form) for this RFP.

BACKGROUND

This project covers the equipment replacement and upgrade of the two important network layers of AFTEL ISP infrastructure, the core layer and the distribution layer. These equipment are the most important equipment, which provide Internet connectivity to International ISPs and servers to route large amounts of Internet traffic in scales of 100 to 150 Gigabits per second, with considering the nearest future data capacity upgrade as well.

SERVICES REQUIRED

The purpose of this procurement is to select a vendor to upgrade the Cisco network equipment of the two important network layers of AFTEL ISP infrastructure, the core layer and the distribution layer. The upgrade will involve replacing hardware (the “Equipment”) that is nearing the end of its Cisco life, add additional capacity, add additional redundancy and increase the speed and bandwidth of the network.

A complete list of the Equipment can be found in a separate Attachment.

All equipment both software & hardware must come under the name of Afghan Telecom Corporation (AFTEL).

The primary goals of this project are as follows:

For Kabul ISP Core and Distribution Upgrade Project along with the equipment we require the complete installation and provisioning of the entire network ISP architecture with the following domain topics which are general guidelines for the provisioning likely to be included on the configuration and provisioning of AFTEL ISP networks. However, other related topics may also appear on any specific delivery of this project and the vendor is responsible to address any configuration requirement at any given time. In order to better reflect the contents of the

configuration and for clarity purposes, the guidelines below may change at any time without notice. We expect the vendor to have minimum of four CCIE in domain of Routing & Switching, Service Provider, Security and Data Centre for the provisioning and setup of this giant network infrastructure which includes over 20+ edge routers that is connected directly with upstream providers in its neighboring countries as well as gulf and European countries.

- At switching layer of this network provisioning the vendor is responsible for the complete configuration and provisioning of L2 services, VLANs, Trunking, VRRP, VTPv3, STP services and other L2 services like Ether channels at layer 2 and layer 3, multiple spanning tree etc.
- At layer 3 of this network the vendor is responsible for the complete configuration and provisioning of L3 services according to the requirements of the network which includes configuration of EIGRP, OSPF, RIP in mix environment both for IPv4 & IPv6 with security parameters in place (authentication, encryptions) and other factors may involve redistribution between routing protocols at multiple points, traffic engineering, route summarization at border routers between areas in any of the given protocols, OSPF LSA tunings in multiple areas, path selection tunings for EIGRP & OSPF protocols, policy based routing, enhanced object track configuration between Kabul & regional sites, route filtering in EIGRP & OSPF, load balance configuration for equal usage of multiple links between sites in country according to the requirements of the project.
- IS-IS (Intermediate System to Intermediate System) configuration in Kabul & regional networks for both level 1 & level 2 according to the requirements of Afghan Telecom Networks which includes route leaking strategy at IGP level between IS-IS and other IGP protocols like OSPF, EIGRP and RIP at some extent and the vendor may get involved in configuration of OSPFv3 & EIGRP for IPv6, IS-IS route filtering, route leaking, IS-IS Path selection.
- With BGP configuration vendor will be responsible for the configuration of iBGP & eBGP peering between routers in country as well as with upstream providers for IPv4 & IPv6 protocols. The vendor is fully responsible to enhance the BGP configuration according to the needs of AFTEL for instance Route Reflector Configuration, BGP NLRI, Best Path Selection for iBGP & eBGP, BGP Traffic Engineering, BGP aggregation, BGP filtering, BGP load balancing between multiple upstream providers, BGP configuration in conjunction with MPLS services. Policy Based Routing where each router will be connected with four different locations and two upstream (especially the edge routers) the configuration must meet the requirement of automatic failover unnoticeably.
- MPLS (Multi-Protocol Label Switching) configuration and implementation in Kabul core network as well as regional sites which is between 30+ XR routers, the required configuration for MPLS services would be MPLS LDP, MPLS VRF Aware services with RT, RD configuration, L2 MPLS, L3 MPLS & L4 MPLS VPN services with PE-CE concepts, integration of IS-IS, OSPF, EIGRP routing protocol in connection with MPLS both for IPv4 & IPv6.

- Other configuration for MPLS involves Inter-AS MPLS configuration between AFTEL AS and upstream AS for transit services, ability for Central services, Carrier Supporting Carrier (CSC), L2VPN/AToM, L3VPN over MPLS TE, VPLS Services VPLS BGP Based Auto discovery, H-VPLS, MPLS Traffic Engineering, Fast re-Route and link protections, LISP Ingress Load Balancing, IPSP IPv6 over IPV4, Multicast VPN configuration according to the design and MPLS QoS configuration.
- Within the datacenter structure mainly with Nexus context the vendor is responsible to bring the complete equipment for the provisioning and the project and configuration of nexus aggregation and distribution layer will involve Virtual Port Channeling (vPC+), Fabric Path, Multi Topology Routing setup, FCoE over Fabric Path, Integration of Multicast routing between each layer, Nexus Fabric Extender (FEX) setup, Layer 3 Routing on Nexus (EIGRP, OSPF & BGP) OTV setup between Kabul and regional sites, implementation of unified computing solution.
- Miscellaneous configuration may involve EIGRP IP FRR, OSPF LFA, Bidirectional Forwarding Detection (BFD), IGP & BGP routing optimization, IPv6 configuration over protocols like OSPF, EIGRP, IS-IS, BGP and MPLS, Multicast routing configuration like PIM sparse mode, multicast RPF, Bootstrap router (BSR), QoS configuration, IOS Security both for control plane and data plane, IPv6 first hop security.

Tasks required from this effort will include but are not limited to:

- Equipment Procurement.
- Testing, Monitoring, Inspection and installation of these Cisco devices.
- Completing the testing of upgraded equipment.

Deliverables from this effort will include:

- An updated Project Plan to include configuration updates, rack clean-up and a revised schedule for Installation and Testing.
- A Test Plan that will be reviewed and approved by the AFTEL team and implemented by Contractor.
- Updated Visio network diagram to reflect the updated as-built network configuration at the end of the project.

PROJECT ASSUMPTIONS

Contractor should base its proposal on the following assumptions:

- Contractor will be required to perform the installations on weekends, or in approved timeslots with no or limited service disruptions.
- Appropriate AFTEL staff members will be available for consultation with Contractor's engineers as needed to provide information or answers to specific questions related to the current environment.
- Any existing network documentation will be made available to Contractor.
- All systems or devices to be assessed reside at AFTEL's main campus location in Kabul, and its domestic locations.

SCOPE OF WORK

Phase I – Procurement

The Equipment being upgraded is outlined in Attachment. The Contractor will determine the appropriate upgrade path and recommend the solution to AFTEL staff.

- Contractor will procure the Equipment and assure that all parts, licenses and equipment are delivered and are in working order.
- All equipment and licenses will be registered to AFTEL as the owner.
- All equipment will come with a minimum one-year warranty.
- All equipment will have two years Smartnet - SNTC-8X5XNBD contract and Smartnet support/services will start after the date of activation of the Smartnet account.
- All delivery, shipping, and travel expenses should be included in the proposed procurement cost.
- Contractor will submit a final project schedule for AFTEL approval.

Phase II – Configuration and site Preparation

Contractor is expected to configure the switches and prepare the sites for installation. Configurations and access to AFTEL's current switches will be made available. Prior to the installation, Contractor will review the current configurations with the AFTEL staff.

- Contractor is expected to submit a description of all recommended changes to the current configuration.
- Contractor is also expected to submit a detailed configuration solution for replacing the current solution and back out plan.

Phase III- Installation

AFTEL staff will coordinate with Contractor on the installation. It is expected that the installation will be performed in three phases: (1) AFTEL Edge Routers; (2) AFTEL Core Routers/Switches; and (3) AFTEL Distribution Switches. Contractor shall identify the level of support required from the two AFTEL staff resources that will be made available to support the installations.

- Network downtime will be minimized as work will be performed only during weekend hours, or in approved timeslots with no or limited service disruptions..

Phase IV – Testing

Prior to the installation, a test sheet will be presented for review and approval by AFTEL staff. Contractor will perform all testing with the involvement of AFTEL staff. All test results will be documented and issues will be tracked throughout the project and resolved by the Contractor to the satisfaction of AFTEL.

SECTION 6 GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. Definitions 1.1 The following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them:
- (a) “GOVERNMENT” means the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan.
 - (b) “CONTRACT” means the Contract Agreement entered into between the Entity and the Supplier, together with the Contract Documents referred to therein, including all attachments, appendices, and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
 - (c) “CONTRACT DOCUMENTS” means the documents listed in the Contract Agreement, including any amendments thereto.
 - (d) “CONTRACT PRICE” means the price payable to the Supplier as specified in the Contract Agreement, subject to such additions and adjustments thereto or deductions there from, as may be made pursuant to the Contract.
 - (e) “DAY” means calendar day.
 - (f) “COMPLETION” means the fulfillment of the Related Services by the Supplier in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the Contract.
 - (g) “GCC” means the General Conditions of Contract.
 - (h) “GOODS” means all of the commodities, raw material, machinery and equipment, and/or other materials that the Supplier is required to supply to the Entity under the Contract.
 - (i) “ENTITY” means the entity purchasing the Goods and Related Services, as **specified in the SCC**.
 - (j) “RELATED SERVICES” means the services incidental to the supply of the goods, such as insurance, installation, training and initial maintenance and other such obligations of the Supplier under the Contract.
 - (k) “SCC” means the Special Conditions of Contract.
 - (l) “SUBCONTRACTOR” means any natural person, private or government entity, or a combination of the above, to which any part of the Goods to be supplied or execution of any part of the Related Services is subcontracted by the Supplier.
 - (m) “SUPPLIER” means the natural person, private or government entity, or a combination of the above, whose Bid to perform the Contract has been accepted by the Entity and is named as such in

the Contract Agreement.

- (n) “THE PROJECT SITE”, where applicable, means the place **named in the SCC**.

2. Contract Documents 2.1 Subject to the order of precedence set forth in the Contract Agreement, all documents forming the Contract (and all parts thereof) are intended to be correlative, complimentary and mutually explanatory. The Contract agreement shall be read as a whole.
3. Fraud and Corruption 3.1 If the Entity determines that the Supplier has engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive or obstructive practices, in competing for or in executing the Contract, then the Entity may, after giving 14 days notice to the Supplier, terminate the Supplier's employment under the Contract and cancel the contract, and the provisions of Clause 35 shall apply as if such expulsion had been made under Sub-Clause 35.1.
- (a) For the purposes of this Sub-Clause:
- (i) “CORRUPT PRACTICE” is the offering, giving, receiving or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party;
 - (ii) “FRAUDULENT PRACTICE” is any actor omission, including a misrepresentation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation;
 - (iii) “COLLUSIVE PRACTICE” is an arrangement between two or more parties designed to achieve an improper purpose, including to influence improperly the actions of another party;
 - (iv) “COERCIVE PRACTICE” is impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party to influence improperly the actions of a party;
 - (v) “OBSTRUCTIVE PRACTICE” is “OBSTRUCTIVE PRACTICE” is deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering or concealing of evidence material to the investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede a Government investigation into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation; or acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Government’s inspection and audit rights.
- 3.2 Should any employee of the Supplier or the Entity be determined to have engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practice during the purchase of the Goods, then that employee shall be

removed and is liable to prosecution. As well as payment of penalties and compensation. Procurement Officials are also liable to administrative sanctions.

4. Interpretation 4.1 If the context so requires it, singular also means plural and vice versa.

4.2 *Incoterms*

(a) Unless inconsistent with any provision of the Contract, the meaning of any trade term and the rights and obligations of parties there under shall be as prescribed by *Incoterms*, as **stated in the SCC**;

(b) The terms, when used, shall be governed by the rules prescribed in the current edition of *Incoterms* **specified in the SCC** and published by the International Chamber of Commerce in Paris, France.

4.3 Entire Agreement

The Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the Entity and the Supplier and supersedes all communications, negotiations and agreements (whether written or oral) of the parties with respect thereto made prior to the date of Contract.

4.4 Amendment

No amendment or other variation of the Contract shall be valid unless it is in writing, is dated, expressly refers to the Contract, and is signed by a duly authorized representative of each party thereto.

4.5 Non-waiver

(a) Subject to GCC Sub-Clause 4.5(b) below, no relaxation, forbearance, delay, or indulgence by either party in enforcing any of the terms and conditions of the Contract or the granting of time by either party to the other shall prejudice, affect, or restrict the rights of that party under the Contract, neither shall any waiver by either party of any breach of Contract operate as waiver of any subsequent or continuing breach of Contract.

(b) Any waiver of a party's rights, powers, or remedies under the Contract must be in writing, dated, and signed by an authorized representative of the party granting such waiver, and must specify the right and the extent to which it is being waived.

4.6 Severability

If any provision or condition of the Contract is prohibited or rendered invalid or unenforceable, such prohibition, invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provisions and conditions of the Contract.

5. Language
- 5.1 The Contract as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Contract exchanged by the Supplier and the Purchaser, shall be written in the language **specified in the SCC**. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Contract may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in the language specified, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Contract, this translation shall govern.
- 5.2 The Supplier shall bear all costs of translation to the governing language and all risks of the accuracy of such translation, for documents provided by the Supplier.
6. Joint Venture
- 6.1 If the Supplier is a joint venture (JV), a consortium, or association, all of the parties shall be jointly and severally liable to the Entity for the fulfillment of the provisions of the Contract and shall designate one party to act as a leader with authority to bind the JV, consortium, or association. The composition or the constitution of the JV, consortium, or association shall not be altered without the prior consent of the Purchaser.
7. Eligibility
- 7.1 The Supplier and its Subcontractors shall have the nationality of an eligible country. A Supplier or Subcontractor shall be deemed to have the nationality of a country if it is a citizen or constituted, incorporated, or registered, and operates in conformity with the provisions of the laws of that country.
- 7.2 All Goods and Related Services to be supplied under the Contract and financed by the Government shall have their origin in Eligible Countries. For the purpose of this Clause, origin means the country where the goods have been grown, mined, cultivated, produced, manufactured, or processed; or through manufacture, processing, or assembly, another commercially recognized article results that differs substantially in its basic characteristics from its components.
8. Notices
- 8.1 Any notice given by one party to the other pursuant to the Contract shall be in writing to the address **specified in the SCC**. The term “IN WRITING” means communicated in written form with proof of receipt.
- 8.2 A notice shall be effective when delivered or on the notice’s effective date, whichever is later.
9. Governing Law
- 9.1 The Contract shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan.
10. Settlement of
- 10.1 The Entity and the Supplier shall make every effort to resolve amicably by direct informal negotiation any disagreement or dispute arising

- Disputes between them under or in connection with the Contract
- 10.2 If, after twenty-eight (28) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, Arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure **specified in the SCC**.
- 10.3 Notwithstanding any reference to arbitration herein,
- (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the Contract unless they otherwise agree; and
- (b) the Entity shall pay the Supplier any monies due the Supplier.
11. Inspections and Audit by the Government 11.1 The Supplier shall permit the Government and/or persons appointed by the Government to inspect the Supplier’s offices and/or the accounts and records of the Supplier and its sub-contractors relating to the performance of the Contract, and to have such accounts and records audited by auditors appointed by the Government if required by the Government. The Supplier’s attention is drawn to Clause 3, which provides, *inter alia*, that acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Government’s inspection and audit rights provided for under Sub-Clause 11.1 constitute a prohibited practice subject to contract termination (as well as to a determination of ineligibility under the Procurement Guidelines).
12. Scope of Supply 12.1 The Goods and Related Services to be supplied shall be as specified in the Schedule of Requirements.
13. Delivery and Documents 13.1 Subject to GCC Sub-Clause 33.1, the Delivery of the Goods and Completion of the Related Services shall be in accordance with the Delivery and Completion Schedule specified in the Schedule of Requirements. The details of shipping and other documents to be furnished by the Supplier are **specified in the SCC**.
14. Supplier’s Responsibilities 14.1 The Supplier shall supply all the Goods and Related Services included in the Scope of Supply in accordance with GCC Clause 12, and the Delivery and Completion Schedule, as per GCC Clause 13.
15. Contract Price 15.1 Prices charged by the Supplier for the Goods supplied and the Related Services performed under the Contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the Supplier in its Bid, with the exception of any price adjustments **authorized in the SCC**.
16. Terms of Payment 16.1 The Contract Price, including any Advance Payments, if applicable, shall be paid as **specified in the SCC**.
- 16.2 The Supplier’s request for payment shall be made to the Entity in

writing, accompanied by invoices describing, as appropriate, the Goods delivered and Related Services performed, and by the documents submitted pursuant to GCC Clause 13 and upon fulfillment of all other obligations stipulated in the Contract.

- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the Entity, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or request for payment by the Supplier, Clause 39 of Procurement Law is applicable.
- 16.4 The currencies in which payments shall be made to the Supplier under this Contract shall be Afghani unless otherwise those currencies which stated in BDS.
- 16.5 In the event that the Entity fails to pay the Supplier any payment by its due date or within the period **set forth in the SCC**, the Entity shall pay to the Supplier interest on the amount of such delayed payment at the rate **shown in the SCC**, for the period of delay until payment has been made in full, whether before or after judgment or arbitrage award.
17. Taxes and Duties
- 17.1 For goods manufactured outside the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, the Supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, including Business Receipt Tax, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan.
- 17.2 For goods Manufactured within the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, the Supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted Goods to the Purchaser.
- 17.3 If any tax exemptions, reductions, allowances or privileges may be available to the Supplier in the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, the Entity shall use its best efforts to enable the Supplier to benefit from any such tax savings to the maximum allowable extent.
18. Performance Security
- 18.1 As **specified in the SCC**, the Supplier shall furnish contract performance security in the amount **specified in the SCC**. Within ten (10) days of the notification of award.
- 18.2 The proceeds of the Performance Security shall be payable to the Entity as compensation for any loss resulting from the Supplier's failure to complete its obligations under the Contract
- 18.3 As **specified in the SCC**, the Performance Security, if required, shall be denominated in the currency (ies) of the Contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the Purchaser; and shall be in one of the format **stipulated by the Entity in the SCC**, or in another format acceptable to the Purchaser.
- 18.4 The Performance Security shall be discharged by the Entity and returned

to the Supplier not later than twenty-eight (28) days following the date of Completion of the Supplier's performance obligations under the Contract, including any warranty obligations, unless **specified otherwise in the SCC**.

19. Copyright 19.1 The copyright in all drawings, documents, and other materials containing data and information furnished to the Entity by the Supplier herein shall remain vested in the Supplier, or, if they are furnished to the Entity directly or through the Supplier by any third party, including suppliers of materials, the copyright in such materials shall remain vested in such third party.
20. Confidential Information 20.1 The Entity and the Supplier shall keep confidential and shall not, without the written consent of the other party hereto, divulge to any third party any documents, data, or other information furnished directly or indirectly by the other party hereto in connection with the Contract, whether such information has been furnished prior to, during or following completion or termination of the Contract. Notwithstanding the above, the Supplier may furnish to its Subcontractor such documents, data, and other information it receives from the Entity to the extent required for the Subcontractor to perform its work under the Contract, in which event the Supplier shall obtain from such Subcontractor an undertaking of confidentiality similar to that imposed on the Supplier under GCC Clause 20.
- 20.2 The Entity shall not use such documents, data, and other information received from the Supplier for any purposes unrelated to the contract. Similarly, the Supplier shall not use such documents, data, and other information received from the Entity for any purpose other than the performance of the Contract.
- 20.3 The obligation of a party under GCC Sub-Clauses 20.1 and 20.2 above, however, shall not apply to information that:
- (a) the Entity or Supplier need to share with the Government or other institutions participating in the financing of the Contract;
 - (b) now or hereafter enters the public domain through no fault of that party;
 - (c) can be proven to have been possessed by that party at the time of disclosure and which was not previously obtained, directly or indirectly, from the other party; or
 - (d) Otherwise lawfully becomes available to that party from a third party that has no obligation of confidentiality.
- 20.4 The above provisions of GCC Clause 20 shall not in any way modify any undertaking of confidentiality given by either of the parties hereto prior

to the date of the Contract in respect of the Supply or any part thereof.

20.5 The provisions of GCC Clause 20 shall survive completion or termination, for whatever reason, of the Contract.

21. Subcontracting 21.1 The Supplier shall notify the Entity in writing of all subcontracts awarded under the Contract if not already specified in the Bid. The subcontracts should not alter the bid in any material way. Such notification, in the original Bid or later shall not relieve the Supplier from any of its obligations, duties, responsibilities, or liability under the Contract.

21.2 Subcontracts shall comply with the provisions of GCC Clauses 3 and 7.

21.3 If any subcontracting valuing up to 20% of the performance of the contract granted without written consent of the procuring entity, or subcontracting exceeds 20% of the original contract value or the contract is granted as a whole to the subcontractor, the provision of this law as well as the procurement contract signed between the parties involved shall be breached and considered as violation resulting in forfeiture of the performance security and termination of the contract whereby the contractor shall be subject to prosecution under the Law.

22. Specifications and Standards 22.1 Technical Specifications and Drawings

- (a) The Goods and Related Services supplied under this Contract shall conform to the technical specifications and standards mentioned in Section 5 Schedule of Requirements and, when no applicable standard is mentioned, the standard shall be equivalent or superior to the official standards whose application is appropriate to the Goods' country of origin
- (b) The Supplier shall be entitled to disclaim responsibility for any design, data, drawing, specification or other document, or any modification thereof provided or designed by or on behalf of the Purchaser, by giving a notice of such disclaimer to the Purchaser.
- (c) Wherever references are made in the Contract to codes and standards in accordance with which it shall be executed, the edition or the revised version of such codes and standards shall be those specified in the Schedule of Requirements. During Contract execution, any changes in any such codes and standards shall be applied only after approval by the Entity and shall be treated in accordance with GCC Clause 33.

23. Packing and Documents 23.1 The Supplier shall provide such packing of the Goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the Contract. During transit, the packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling and

exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation, and open storage. Packing case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

- 23.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the Contract, including additional requirements, if any, **specified in the SCC**, and in any other instructions ordered by the Purchaser.
24. Insurance 24.1 Unless otherwise **specified in the SCC**, the Goods supplied under the Contract shall be fully insured -in a freely convertible currency from an eligible country- against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage, and delivery, in accordance with the applicable *Incoterms* or in the manner **specified in the SCC**.
25. Transportation 25.1 Unless otherwise **specified in the SCC**, responsibility for arranging transportation of the Goods shall be in accordance with the specified *Incoterms*.
26. Inspections and Tests 26.1 The Supplier shall at its own expense and at no cost to the Entity carry out all such tests and/or inspections of the Goods and Related Services as are **specified in the SCC**.
- 26.2 The inspections and tests may be conducted on the premises of the Supplier or its Subcontractor, at point of delivery, and/or at the Goods' final destination, or in another place in the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan as **specified in the SCC**. Subject to GCC Sub-Clause 26.3, if conducted on the premises of the Supplier or its Subcontractor, all reasonable facilities and assistance, including access to drawings and production data, shall be furnished to the inspectors at no charge to the Purchaser.
- 26.3 The Entity or its designated representative shall be entitled to attend the tests and/ or inspections referred to in GCC Sub-Clause 26.2, provided that the Entity bear all of its own costs and expenses incurred in connection with such attendance including, but not limited to, all travelling and board and lodging expenses
- 26.4 Whenever the Supplier is ready to carry out any such test and inspection, it shall give a reasonable advance notice, including the place and time, to the Purchaser. The Supplier shall obtain from any relevant third party or manufacturer any necessary permission or consent to enable the Entity or its designated representative to attend the test and/or inspection.
- 26.5 The Entity may require the Supplier to carry out any test and/or inspection not required by the Contract but deemed necessary to verify

that the characteristics and performance of the Goods comply with the technical specifications codes and standards under the Contract, provided that the Supplier's reasonable costs and expenses incurred in the carrying out of such test and/or inspection shall be added to the Contract Price. Further, if such test and/or inspection impedes the progress of manufacturing and/or the Supplier's performance of its other obligations under the Contract, due allowance will be made in respect of the Delivery Dates and Completion Dates and the other obligations so affected.

26.6 The Supplier shall provide the Entity with a report of the results of any such test and/or inspection.

26.7 The Entity may reject any Goods or any part thereof that fail to pass any test and/or inspection or do not conform to the specifications. The Supplier shall either rectify or replace such rejected Goods or parts thereof or make alterations necessary to meet the specifications at no cost to the Purchaser, and shall repeat the test and/or inspection, at no cost to the Purchaser, upon giving a notice pursuant to GCC Sub-Clause 26.4.

26.8 The Supplier agrees that neither the execution of a test and/or inspection of the Goods or any part thereof, nor the attendance by the Entity or its representative, nor the issue of any report pursuant to GCC Sub-Clause 26.6, shall release the Supplier from any warranties or other obligations under the Contract.

27. Penalty

27.1 If the Supplier fails to deliver any or all of the Goods and/or perform the related Services within the period specified in the Contract, pursuant to article [39] of the law and rule [108] of the Rules of Procedure, the entity deducts penalties from the Contract Price. When the total percentage of delay penalty reach [10%] of the contract value, the contract would be terminated pursuant to GCC Clause 35.

28. Warranty

28.1 The Supplier warrants that all the Goods are new, unused, and of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials, unless provided otherwise in the Contract.

28.2 Subject to GCC Sub-Clause 22.1(b), the Supplier further warrants that the Goods shall be free from defects arising from any act or omission of the Supplier or arising from design, materials, and workmanship, under normal use in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.

28.3 Unless otherwise **specified in the SCC**, the warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the Goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination **indicated in the SCC**, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of

shipment from the port or place of loading in the country of origin, whichever period concludes earlier.

28.4 The Entity shall give notice to the Supplier stating the nature of any such defects together with all available evidence thereof, promptly following the discovery thereof. The Entity shall afford all reasonable opportunity for the Supplier to inspect such defects.

28.5 Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, within the period **specified in the SCC**, expeditiously repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof, at no cost to the Purchaser.

28.6 If having been notified, the Supplier fails to remedy the defect within the period **specified in the SCC**, the Entity may proceed to take within a reasonable period such remedial action as may be necessary, at the Supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the Entity may have against the Supplier under the Contract.

29. Patent
Indemnity

29.1 The Supplier shall, subject to the Purchaser's compliance with GCC Sub-Clause 29.2, indemnify and hold harmless the Entity and its employees and officers from and against any and all suits, actions or administrative proceedings, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, and expenses of any nature, including attorney's fees and expenses, which the Entity may suffer as a result of any infringement or alleged infringement of any patent, utility model, registered design, trademark, copyright, or other intellectual property right registered or otherwise existing at the date of the Contract by reason of:

- (a) the installation of the Goods by the Supplier or the use of the Goods in the country where the Site is located; and
- (b) the sale in any country of the products produced by the Goods

Such indemnity shall not cover any use of the Goods or any part thereof other than for the purpose indicated by or to be reasonably inferred from the Contract, neither any infringement resulting from the use of the Goods or any part thereof, or any products produced thereby in association or combination with any other equipment, plant, or materials not supplied by the Supplier, pursuant to the Contract.

29.2 If any proceedings are brought or any claim is made against the Entity arising out of the matters referred to in GCC Sub-Clause 29.1, the Entity shall promptly give the Supplier a notice thereof, and the Supplier may at its own expense and in the Purchaser's name conduct such proceedings or claim and any negotiations for the settlement of any such proceedings or claim.

29.3 If the Supplier fails to notify the Entity within twenty-eight (28) days after receipt of such notice that it intends to conduct any such

proceedings or claim, then the Entity shall be free to conduct the same on its own behalf.

29.4 The Entity shall, at the Supplier's request, afford all available assistance to the Supplier in conducting such proceedings or claim, and shall be reimbursed by the Supplier for all reasonable expenses incurred in so doing.

29.5 The Entity shall indemnify and hold harmless the Supplier and its employees, officers, and Subcontractors from and against any and all suits, actions or administrative proceedings, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, and expenses of any nature, including Attorney's fees and expenses, which the Supplier may suffer as a result of any infringement or alleged infringement of any patent, utility model, registered design, trademark, copyright, or other intellectual property right registered or otherwise existing at the date of the Contract arising out of or in connection with any design, data, drawing, specification, or other documents or materials provided or designed by or on behalf of the Entity.

30. Limitation of Liability

30.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct:

- (a) the Supplier shall not be liable to the Purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the Supplier to pay liquidated damages to the Purchaser; and
- (b) the aggregate liability of the Supplier to the Purchaser, whether under the Contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total Contract Price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment, or to any obligation of the supplier to indemnify the entity with respect to patent infringement.

31. Change in Laws and Regulations

31.1 Unless otherwise specified in the Contract, if after the date of 28 days prior to date of Bid submission, any law, regulation, ordinance, order, circular or bylaw having the force of law is enacted, promulgated, abrogated, or changed in the place of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan where the Site is located (which shall be deemed to include any change in interpretation or application by the competent authorities) that subsequently affects the Delivery Date and/or the Contract Price, then such Delivery Date and/or Contract Price shall be correspondingly increased or decreased, to the extent that the Supplier has thereby been affected in the performance of any of its obligations under the Contract. Notwithstanding the foregoing, such additional or reduced cost shall not be separately paid or credited if the same has already been accounted for

in the price adjustment provisions where applicable.

32. *Force Majeure*
- 32.1 The Supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its Performance Security, liquidated damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that its delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the Contract is the result of an event of *Force Majeure*.
- 32.2 For purposes of this Clause, “*FORCE MAJEURE*” means an event or situation beyond the control of the Supplier that is not foreseeable, is unavoidable, and its origin is not due to negligence or lack of care on the part of the Supplier. Such events may include, but not be limited to, acts of the Entity in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, and freight embargoes.
- 32.3 If a *Force Majeure* situation arises, the Supplier shall promptly notify the Entity in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the Entity in writing, the Supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the Contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the *Force Majeure* event.
33. Change Orders and Contract Amendments
- 33.1 The Entity may at any time order the Supplier through notice in accordance GCC Clause 8, to make changes within the general scope of the Contract in any one or more of the following:
- (a) drawings, designs, or specifications, where Goods to be furnished under the Contract are to be specifically manufactured for the Purchaser;
 - (b) the method of shipment or packing;
 - (c) the place of delivery; and
 - (d) the Related Services to be provided by the Supplier.
- 33.2 If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for, the Supplier’s performance of any provisions under the Contract, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Contract Price or in the Delivery/ Completion Schedule, or both, and the Contract shall accordingly be amended. Any claims by the Supplier for adjustment under this Clause must be asserted within twenty-eight (28) days from the date of the Supplier’s receipt of the Purchaser’s change order.
- 33.3 Prices to be charged by the Supplier for any Related Services that might be needed but which were not included in the Contract shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the Supplier for similar services.
- 33.4 Subject to the above, no variation in or modification of the terms of the Contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the

parties.

34. Extensions of Time
- 34.1 If at any time during performance of the Contract, the Supplier or its subcontractors should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the Goods or completion of Related Services pursuant to GCC Clause 13, the Supplier shall promptly notify the Entity in writing of the delay, its likely duration, and its cause. As soon as practicable after receipt of the Supplier's notice, the Entity shall evaluate the situation and may at its discretion extend the Supplier's time for performance, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of the Contract.
- 34.2 Except in case of *Force Majeure*, as provided under GCC Clause 32, a delay by the Supplier in the performance of its Delivery and Completion obligations shall render the Supplier liable to the imposition of liquidated damages pursuant to GCC Clause 26, unless an extension of time is agreed upon, pursuant to GCC Sub-Clause 34.1.
35. Contract Termination
- 35.1 Termination due to the contractual violation
- (a) The Purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of Contract, by written notice of default sent to the Supplier, may terminate the Contract in whole or in part:
- (i) if the Supplier fails to deliver any or all of the Goods within the period specified in the Contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the Entity pursuant to GCC Clause 34;
- (ii) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation under the Contract; or
- (iii) if the Supplier, in the judgment of the Entity has engaged in fraud and corruption, as defined in GCC Clause 3, in competing for or in executing the Contract.
- (b) In the event the Entity terminates the Contract in whole or in part, pursuant to GCC Clause 35.1(a), the Entity may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, Goods or Related Services similar to those undelivered or not performed, and the Supplier shall be liable to the Entity for any additional costs for such similar Goods or Related Services. However, the Supplier shall continue performance of the Contract to the extent not terminated.
- 35.2 Termination for Insolvency.
- (a) The Entity may at any time terminate the Contract by giving notice to the Supplier if the Supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In such event, termination will be without compensation to the Supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy that has accrued or will accrue

thereafter to the Entity.

- (b) Unilateral termination by Entity the Entity, by notice sent to the Supplier may terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that termination is for the Entity's convenience, the extent to which performance of the Supplier under the Contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.
- (c) The Goods that are complete and ready for shipment within twenty-eight (28) days after the Supplier's receipt of notice of termination shall be accepted by the Entity at the Contract terms and prices. For the remaining Goods, the Entity may elect:
 - (i) to have any portion completed and delivered at the Contract terms and prices; and/ or
 - (ii) to cancel the remainder and pay to the Supplier an agreed amount for partially completed Goods and Related Services and for materials and parts previously procured by the Supplier.

- 36. Assignment 36.1 Neither the Entity nor the Supplier shall assign, in whole or in part, their obligations under this Contract, except with prior written consent of the other party.
- 37. Export
Restriction 37.1 Notwithstanding any obligation under the Contract to complete all export formalities, any export restrictions attributable to the Entity, to the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, or to the use of the products/ goods, systems or services to be supplied, which arise from trade regulations from a country supplying those products/ goods, systems or services, and which substantially impede the Supplier from meeting its obligations under the Contract, shall release the Supplier from the obligation to provide deliveries or services, always provided, however, that the Supplier can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Entity and of the Government that it has completed all formalities in a timely manner, including applying for permits, authorizations and licenses necessary for the export of the products/ goods, systems or services under the terms of the Contract. .

SECTION 7 SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

The following Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) shall supplement and/or amend the General Conditions of Contract (GCC). Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions herein shall prevail over those in the GCC.
